

Healing From Loss is a Journey: *Everyone Experiences Grief Differently*

Our Grief Share ministry will start on Wednesday, September 11th at 6:30 PM - 8:00 PM, led by Pastor Debbie Marion, Minister of Pastoral Care, and Renee Childs. This 13 week grief support group focuses on important grief topics associated with the death of a loved one. Weekly videos feature nationally respected grief experts and real-life stories of people, followed by group discussion. Confidentiality is key to this program.

Many grieving people find they are only beginning the work of healing while friends or family have returned to their daily life routines. Too often people tend to repress their grief instead of allowing it to do the God given work for which it is intended. Don't allow fear of what others may think keep you from what could help you.

Your bereavement experience may be recent or not so recent. The hope is that you will find encouragement, comfort, and help in grieving the death of a spouse, child, sibling, other family members, or friends. No matter what the cause of your loved one's death, this is an opportunity to be around people who understand what you are feeling. You will learn how to recognize the symptoms of being stuck in your grief and that you do not need to stay there. You will learn valuable information about dealing with the changes in your life and renewing your hope for the future. I hope you will consider being part of this valuable ministry.

We were able to provide dental, hearing, and vision screenings in addition to physicals and immunizations to children and youth in need. Our Food Pantry was emptied as we provided food to those in need and, praise God, was refilled again on Monday morning by community members who donated so much food that our Food Pantry was overflowing once more. What a blessing to be able to help families prepare for the school year!

In August, we continued to bless our community through our newest outreach ministry, Inspira of Tampa Bay located in Wimauma, by providing food and donations of puzzles, games, coloring books, crayons and a myriad of other items to help them support neurodivergent children and youth dealing with Autism Spectrum Condition, Dyslexia, Attention Deficit/Hyperactivity Disorder, just to name a few. Thank you to the women attending the Women's Brunch for their contributions to this ministry outreach.

to this church and any ministries in which you are involved in.


