REGISTRATION PROCESS

MONDAY CLASSES

BEGINNERS CONVERSATIONAL SPANISH (157)

Mondays, 8:30 – 10:00 (6 Classes 10/7 – 11/11) in Room 11

Tuition \$45

Limited to 10

The students will learn basic vocabulary and verb structure that will enable them to converse on an elementary level. The class will hopefully find a comfort level with the above through dialogue with other class members. Continued practice will be encouraged during the week using handouts, internet resources, and a textbook. Course will use textbook: Carson Dellosa Skills for Success, Spanish Workbook for Middle School and High Schools Students. The textbook is \$11.00, payable to Center 4Life Learning on October 7th. The textbook can also be purchased in advance at the Center 4Life Learning office.

Hud Richard is a retired Roman Catholic priest who spent 10 years in two inner-city Hispanic parishes in Connecticut (Hartford and New Haven) where he conducted services and some pastoral duties in Spanish. Besides the usual high school and college courses (especially the advance conversional course at Boston College), he spent two summers in intensive language courses. The first was in Cuernavaca, Mexico where he lived with a Mexican family. (Four students in the class.) The second was a Middlebury, Vermont in their International Language School. He taught Spanish (beginning/advance) for two years in a parish elementary school in Connecticut. He also taught an informal class at Kings Point, Sun City Center at the request of some residents. For three years, Hud has taught beginners and intermediate conversational Spanish classes for the Center 4Life Learning.

IMMIGRATION: ITS HISTORY, CURRENT CONTROVERSIES, AND PROPOSALS FOR REFORM (197)

This three-week course will first examine the history of immigration in the Country, up to the present time. In the second week, there will be discussion of the current controversies such as the problem of open borders while the Country needs additional workers in industries such as health care, construction, and agriculture. Finally, the course will look at the proposals that have been made to improve our immigration system, with particular emphasis on the platforms of the major political parties.

Apps determine what the device can do, so the class will concentrate on basic Apps such as *Google Playstore, Email, Calendar, Photos, Camera*, and *Settings*. Apps that expand the use of the device, such as *GoogleDrive, Photos*, and *Maps*, will also be discussed and demonstrated. A basic knowledge of your device is expected.

INTERMEDITATE CONVERSATIONAL SPANISH (192)

In this intermediate course, we will focus on becoming accustomed to the sound of the Spanish language by listening to native speakers through recordings of cuentos (short stories) in Spanish and through video presentations. Exercises in class will include not only listening but also speaking, reading, and writing. Verbs and vocabulary frequently used in conversation will be emphasized as will correct pronunciation of the Spanish language. Verbs in the imperative, past, and future tenses will be introduced especially how they relate to day-to-day conversations. Assignments will be given to encourage use of the language in real life encounters with Spanish speakers in our community. Course will use textbook: Carson Dellosa Skills for Success, Spanish Workbook for Middle School and High Schools Students. The textbook is \$11.00, payable to Center 4Life Learning on October 10. The textbook can also be purchased in advance at the Center 4Life Learning office.

Susan Cintron has a long history of student of the Spanish language. It began on a military base high school in Spain and continued years later in Anne Arundel Community College after she married a man from Puerto Rico. When they moved to Puerto Rico, (where they lived for eight years), She studied for several years with a private teacher from Peru. To ensure that their children would be bilingual, they spoke both Spanish and English at home. After moving back to the U. S., she found her use of the language suffered from the lack of practice and decided to do something, about it. John O'Connor will help the participants understand the information and documents that should be located and assembled to allow spouses and /or children to either handle your affairs should you become incapacitated or settle your affairs upon your passing. The course will lay out a plan for you to follow to prepare for life-changing events. We will cover such areas as emergency contacts, relatives and friends, your professional and medical providers, medical conditions, financial institutions, living expenses, insurance policies, last wishes, and even pet care. An expandable binder will be available for each student to use to collect and store personal documents, \$8, payable to instructor.

John O'Connor is a retired US Army officer with a bachelor's degree in economics and an advanced degree in management. He was an instructor of military personnel involved in the management of the military pay system. Through his involvement with grief groups, experiences with friends and neighbors and volunteer work with individuals with dementia, he has recognized the need for properly preparing for life changing events. He will take a management approach to give you a plan necessary to organize the information and documents to ease the burden on your spouses and/or children upon your death or incapacitation.
