

IMMIGRATION: ITS HISTORY, CURRENT CONTROVERSIES, AND PROPOSALS FOR REFORM (197)

This three-week course will first examine the history of immigration in the Country, up to the present time. In the second week, there will be discussion of the current controversies such as the problem of open borders while the Country needs additional workers in industries such as health care, construction, and agriculture. Finally, the course will look at the proposals that have been made to improve our immigration system, with particular emphasis on the platforms of the major political parties.

Frank Slesnick, PhD is a Professor Emeritus of Economics at Bellarmine University, where he taught for 30 years. He is Vice-Chair of the Center 4Life Learning and has lived in Kings Point for a number of years.
